Our Citizens Turn Out En Masse to
Celebrate May Day With
the Children.

No End of Amusement to the Young
People.—The Workmen and
Woodmen Deserving
of Praise.

May Day opened bright, clear and
pleasant, and the little folks were
out bright and early in the morn-
ing, eager for the fun of the day.

By 10 o'clock, a stream of vehicles
of every kind was moving towards
the race track, where the picnic,
given jointly by the Woodmen and
Workmen, was to be held. Men, wo-
men and children crowded into the
vehicles, while men, women and chil-
dren went afoot. By 1:30 p. m., the
largest crowd that had ever gather-
ed at the race track grounds were
present to witness the sports of the
day. The grand stand was crowded
to its fullest capacity, while a sur-
ging mass of humanity was crowding
around the May pole platform, and
on the banks on each side of the
race track. The crowd was variously
estimated at from 3,000 to 3,500, the
grand stand alone having a capacity
of nearly one-half of the former
number. To those who served
luncheon to the children, it seemed,
they said, as if there were 2,000 or
3,000 of them alone, from the rapid-
ity with which the sandwiches and
lemonade disappeared.

Everything passed off during the
day pleasantly, and without an inci-
dent or accident to mar the occa-
sion.

The May pole dance by the chil-
dren of the public school and the
kindergarten, was well executed and
was pleasing to all.

The Prescott Brass Band was pres-
ent in the afternoon and discoursed
music.
